Marion qualified from Paris Belleville School of Architecture (France) in 2001 and UCL Bartlett School of Architecture Part III (UK) in 2003.

She gained her early experience in Paris working for Bathelemy Grino Architects on a diverse range of projects including Louis Vuitton shopfront re-designs and the extension of the French Consulate building in London.

Marion moved to London in 2002 and took a post with Snell Associates, where she worked on the detail design stage of the £8.2m redevelopment of the Theatre Royal in Gibraltar. Whilst at Snell Associates, she also worked on the £7.5m remodelling of the Grade II listed Arnolfini Centre for Contemporary Arts in Bristol, taking the project all the way from initial concept, through to completion on site.

Marion joined Paul Davis + Partners as a project architect in 2005 and was made an associate in 2008. She has recently been design team leader on a £10m facade retention project in the conservation area of Hans Town adjacent to Sloane Square. This transformed a tired group of Victorian properties into a highly successful mix of shops, offices and homes, with a total area of 33,000sqft.

Marion is currently doing an MA in sustainable architecture and urbanism at the University of East London and is also a member of Sponge and the Green Register.

Other recent projects led by Marion have included a feasibility study for a 36,000sqft new build mixed use development in Marylebone for British Land, and a series of feasibility proposals for a site in Mayfair, for Balli Real Estate Holdings.
